* The eligibility of players has been extended to allow players born in 2013 to participate in the reserve draws of the two fall U12 Étapes. Indeed, these players cannot participate in the regular 12 and under tournaments. During the year, they have fewer opportunities to earn points to improve their ranking and to qualify for the main draw or the qualifying draw of the fall Étapes.

Players born in 2013 are disadvantaged compared to players born in 2011 and 2012 who can play the reserve draws and accumulate points for the subsequent Étapes.

In some cases, players can obtain an exemption allowing them to take part in tournaments in categories above what is already permitted according to the tables presented here. **Any exemption request can only be presented by a coach** and must be sent by email to Sylvie Giroux, Coach and Athlete Development Director.

Explanatory note

Please note that during the meeting held on February 20th, 2020, the members of the Commission des entraîneurs du Québec approved changes relating to eligibility for sanctioned tournaments that apply since May 1st, 2020. The change pertaining to the eligibility for two-star tournaments was implemented in order to limit the upgrading of players to only one age category. The objective is to encourage the participation of less experienced players in our sanctioned tournaments.

* Please note that from **September 1^{st} each year**, the age eligibility for each category is amended as follows:

This rule is designed to ensure that only the players eligible to participate in the Canadian championships the following year can register to the selection circuit's fall Étapes starting in October.
